Unlike the United Kingdom, Israel, Canada, Australia the United States has more layers

- 3,794,830 sq. miles, 300,000,000 people, 17,500 local L.E. agencies, 3,000 counties, 2500 cities with 10,000 or more, 17 Federal Intelligence Agencies
- There are 2,300 sworn personnel at the Tribal level
- 93,000 federal law enforcement officers across the United States.
- 2 million private security officers.
- 30,000 fire departments spread throughout the U.S. with over seventy percent of them made up entirely of volunteers.
- The strength is that the police are better attuned to their local communities and accountable to their concerns...but a weakness in a post 911 world where information is key.

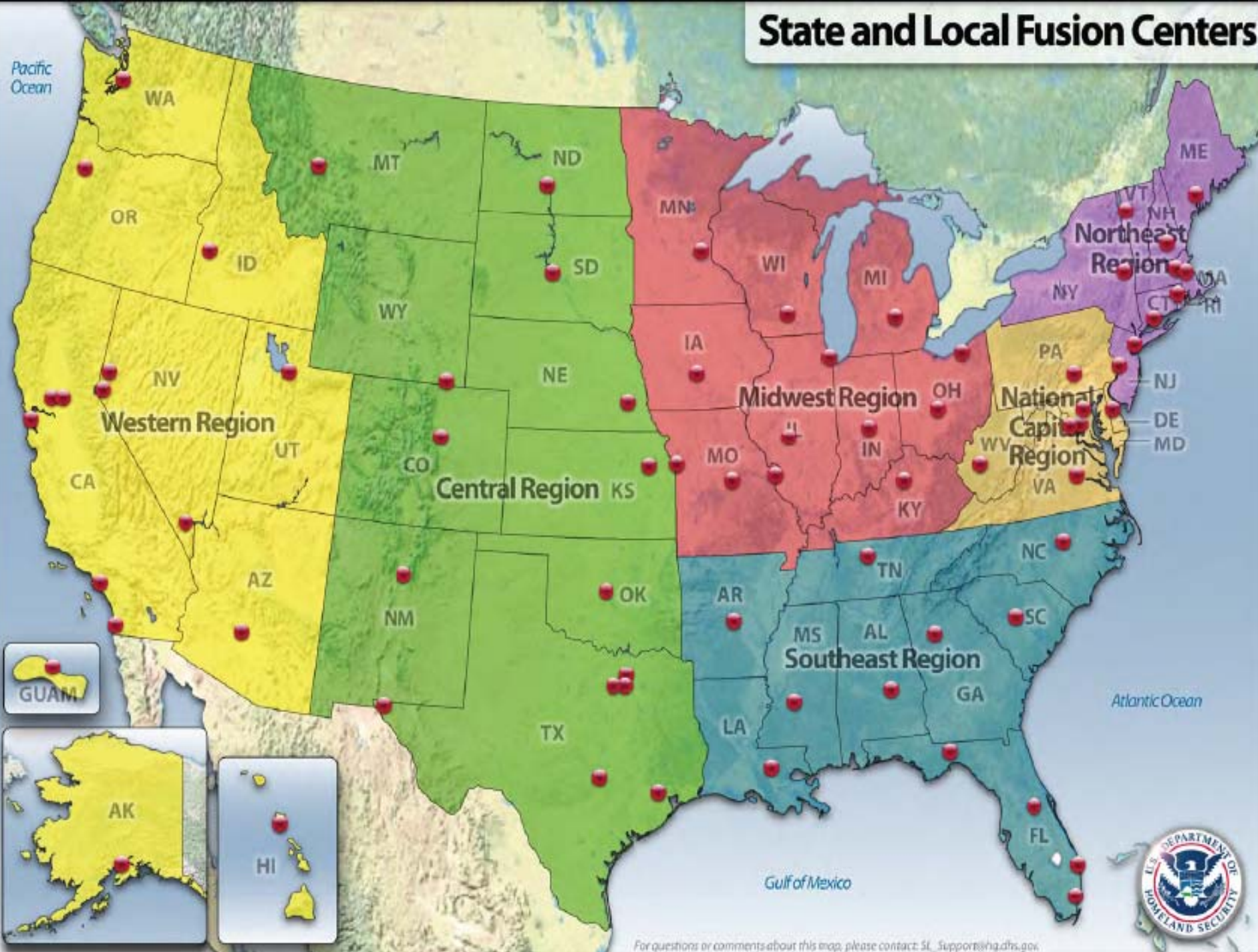

Pacific Ocean



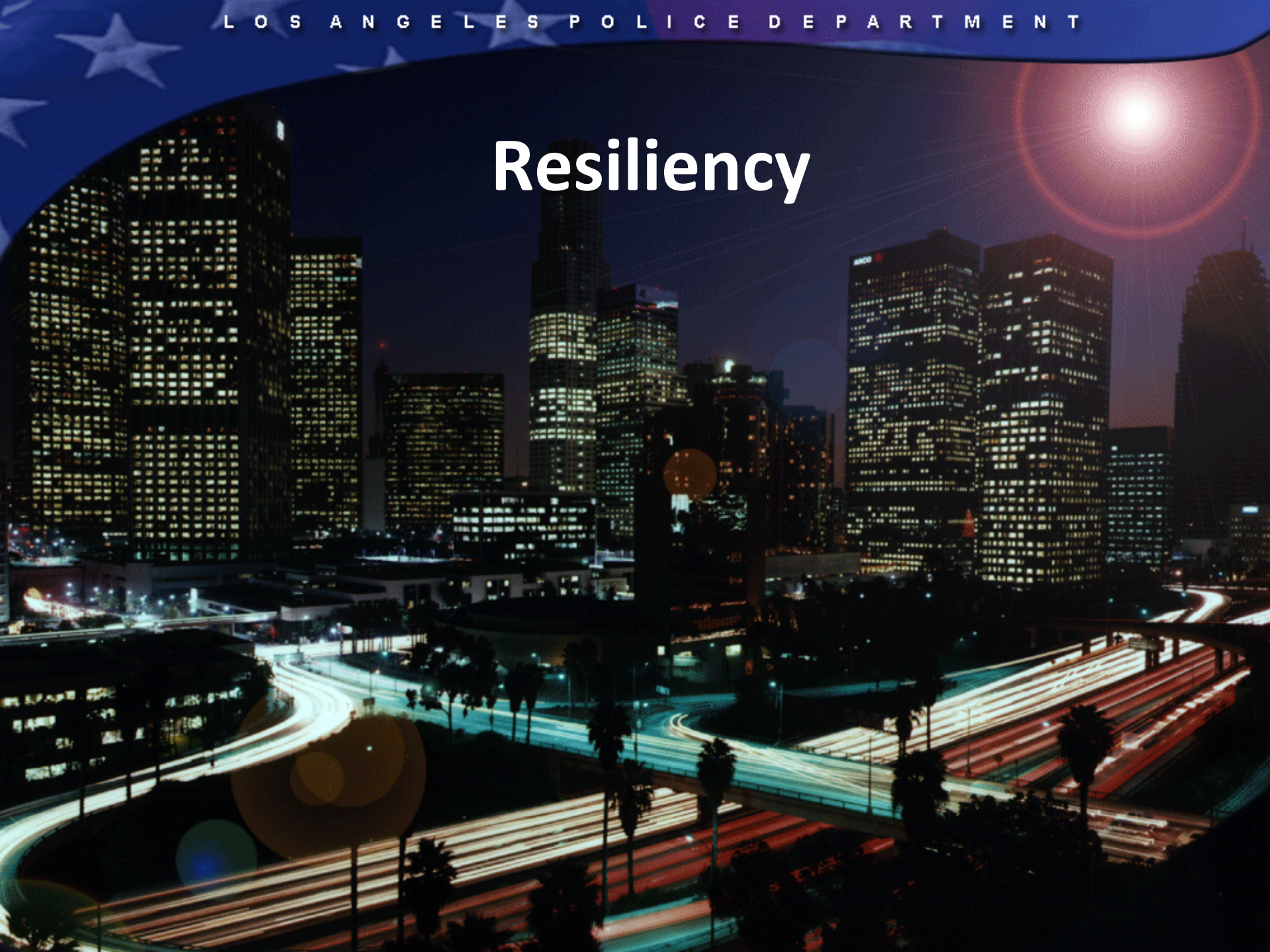
Atlantic Ocean

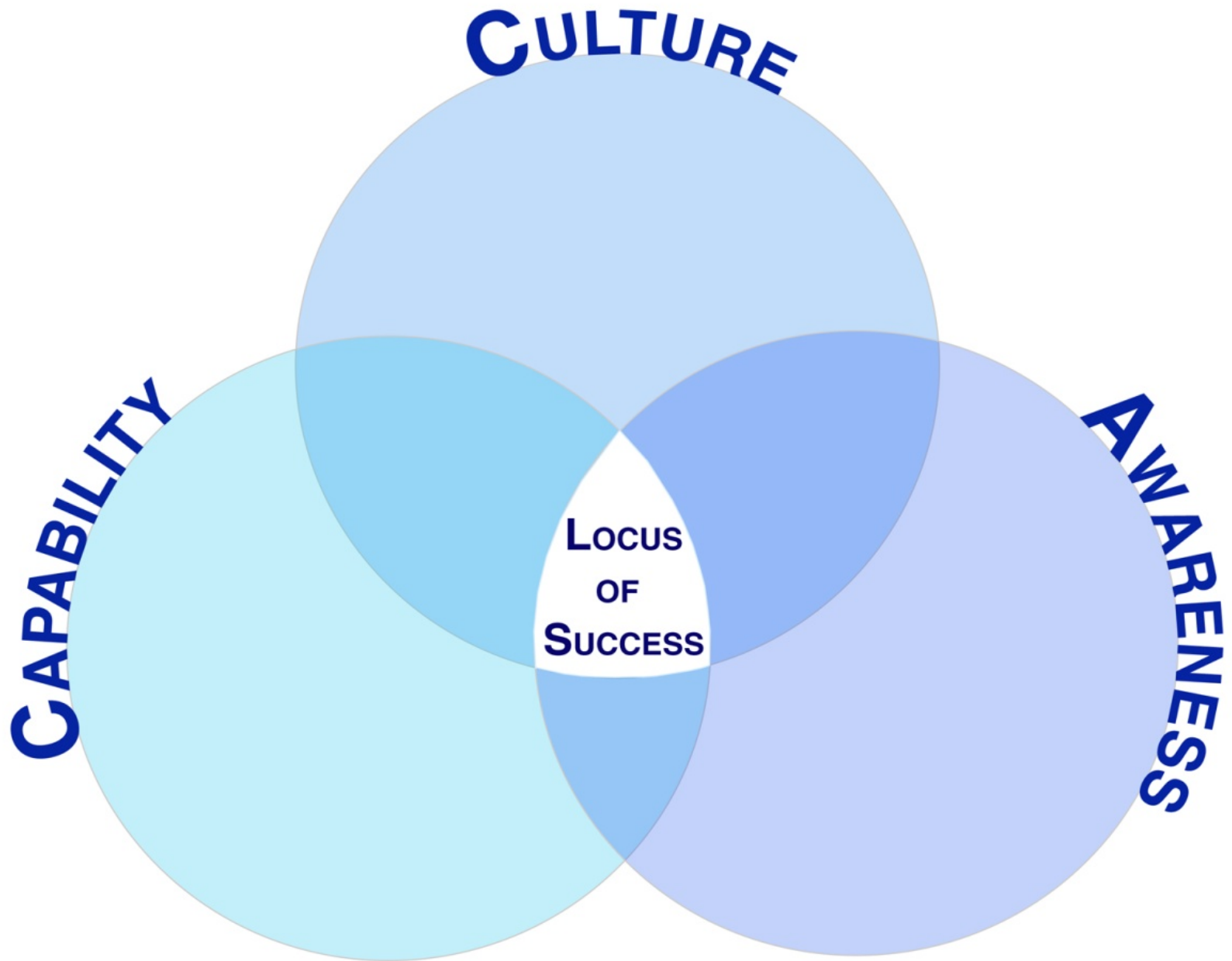


What We Need To Do

Piracy

- The number of piracy and armed robbery incidents on the high seas rose for a third consecutive year in 2009. There were 406 cases of piracy in 2009, an increase of almost 39% from the previous year. This impacts international trade and national security.
