

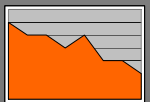

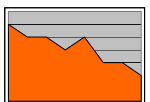

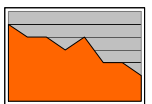
# Olympic Overview

# Paralympic Overview

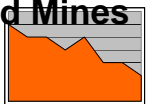
- **10 days of Games: March 12 – 21, 2010**

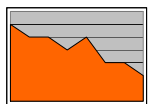


# Vancouver 2010 Integrated Security Unit - Planning

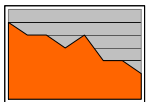


# Olympic Torch Relay

- Integrated security – runners from police agencies from across Canada

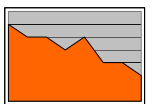


- Torch Relay Security Team (TRuST ) provided for the safety and security of the 12,000 torchbearers from coast to coast to coast.



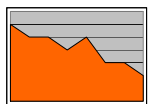
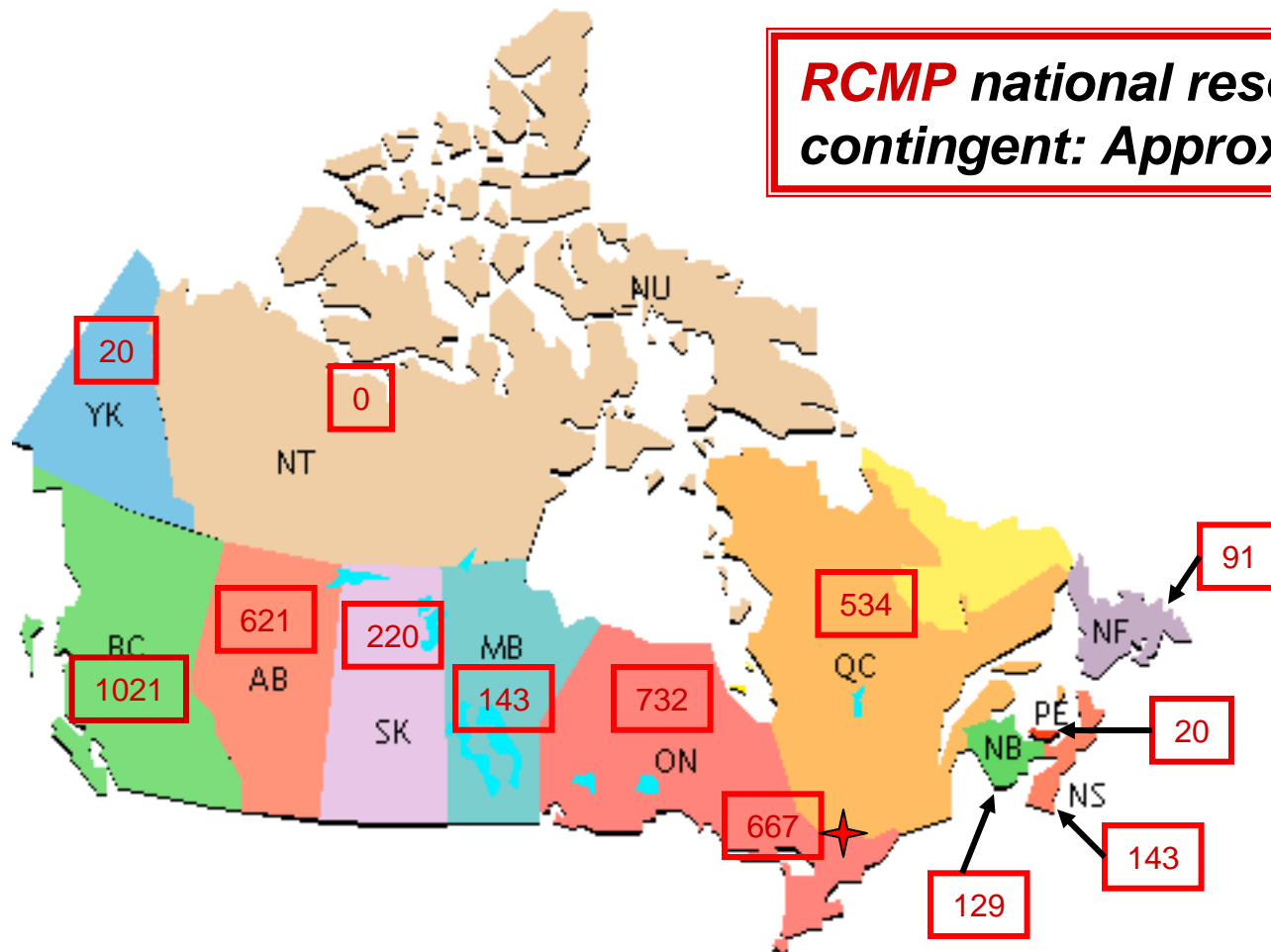

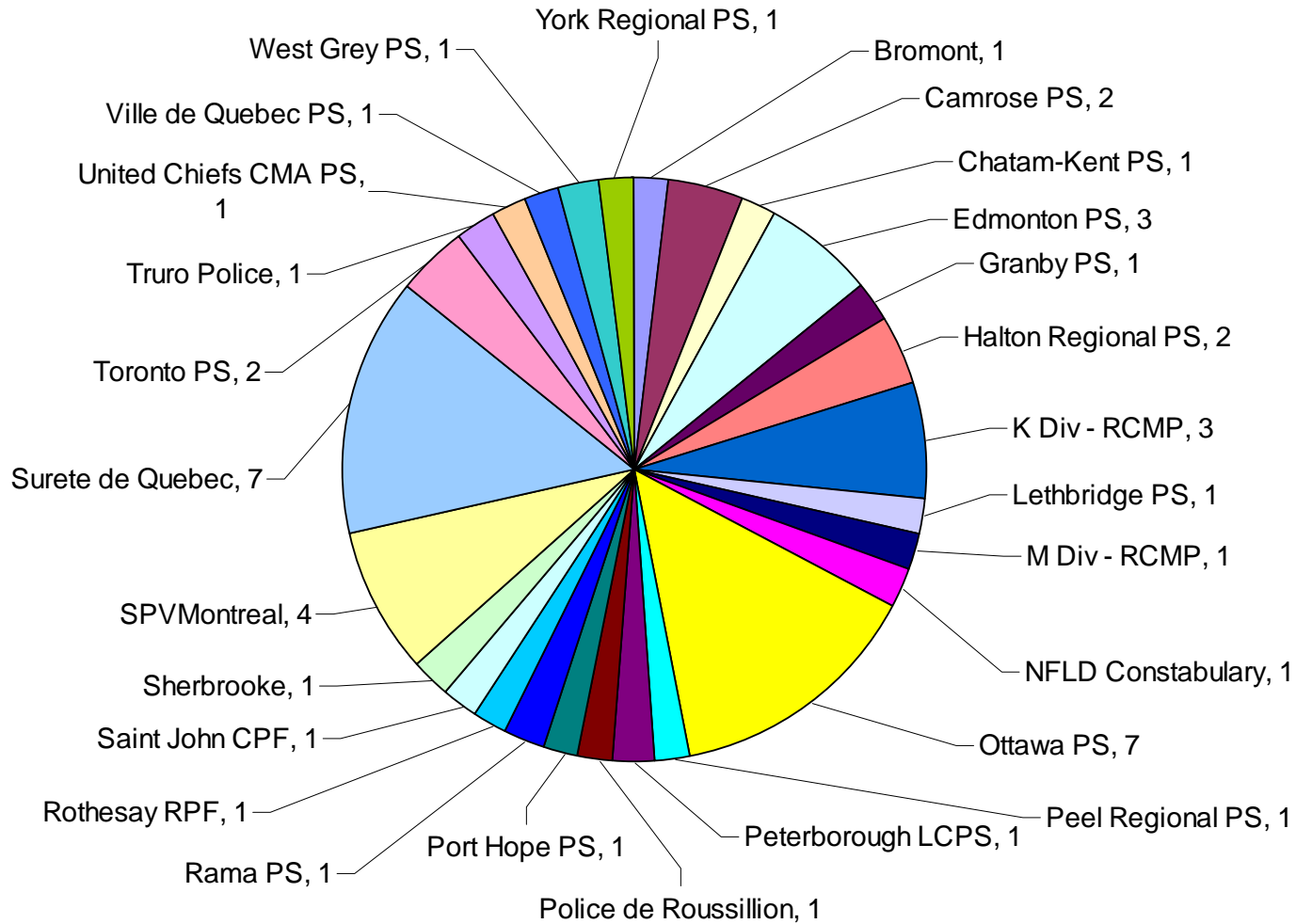

## Cypress Mountain - Generalists Breakdown (All Watches)

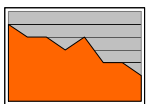


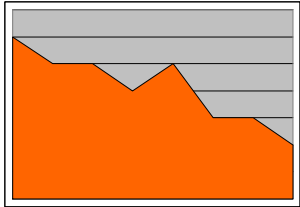

# What is crime reduction?

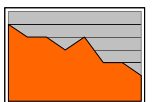
## Strategic objectives:

1. Achieve and maintain a substantial, measurable reduction in the overall crime rate
2. Reduce the public's fear of crime → increase public confidence in the criminal justice system



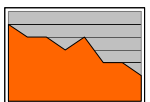
# Key messages for managing policing

- Focus on offenders, not offences
  - Offending is not equally distributed
- Focus on crime hot spots
  - Use mapping, analysis, and problem-oriented policing
- Resources following risk
  - Analysis of data directly impacts operational choices
- Integrated Criminal Justice System
  - One system, not a system of divergent interests



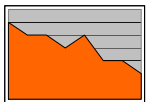
# Emerging best practices

- Critical mass of analytical support
  - A core part of emerging Detachment model of operations
- Daily status of all POs (in/out, warrants etc) monitored in Det.
  - Focus of watch briefings
  - “Breaches matter,” curfew checks, open lines of communication
  - Bail / “show cause” templates ready to go
- Cross-CJS and cross-government partnerships
  - Corrections, Crown, Mental Health, Housing
  - Can add great value with no new dollars
- Focus on measurement
  - Results oriented
  - Individual and overall outcomes



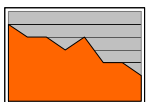
# Partnerships & Integration

- Strategic level:
  - Provincial Community Safety Steering Committee
  - Deputy-level Provincial ministries, policing
- Policy support level:
  - Integrated Criminal Justice Working Group (incl RCMP)
  - Generate operational collaborative projects across agencies, furtherance/development of ICJ vision
- Operational level:
  - Detachments & partners (agencies, communities, NGOs & citizens groups)
  - prolific offender management (POM), bail reform, problem-oriented policing
- SFU/UFV University Chairs in Crime Reduction
  - Policy-focused research

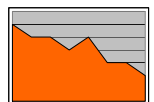
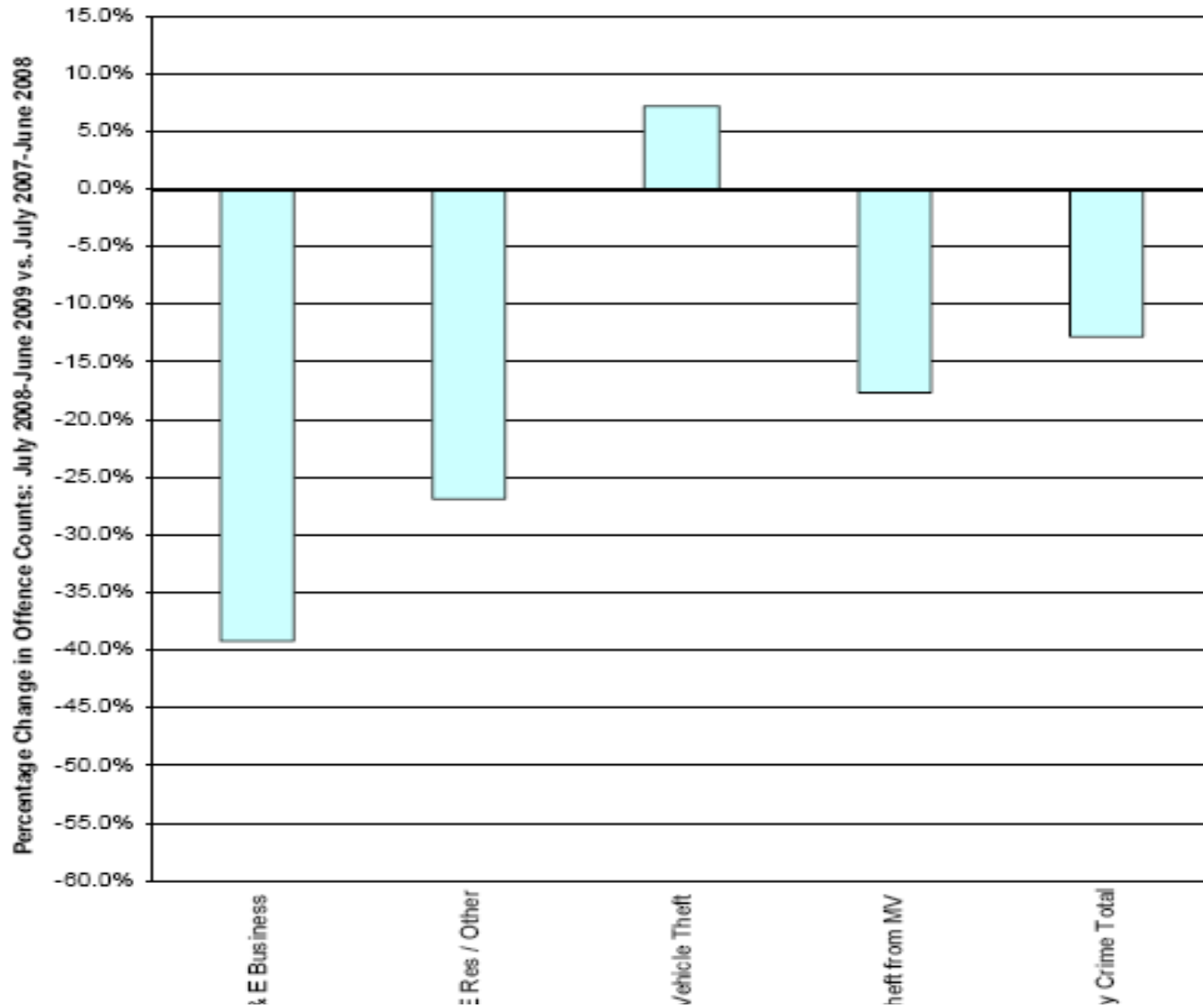


# P.O.M. pilot sites

- Evaluated trial of integrated prolific offender management
  - proceeding in six communities 2008 - 2010

- Agencies participating in 'wraparound':

  - Ministry of Children and Family Development (Youth Justice)
  - Mental Health & Addictions + Adult Forensic Psych. Services
  - Ministry of Employment and Income Assistance
  - BC Housing
- External evaluation (SFU Faculty of Health Sciences)
  - Due Fall 2010

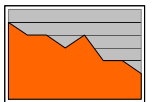
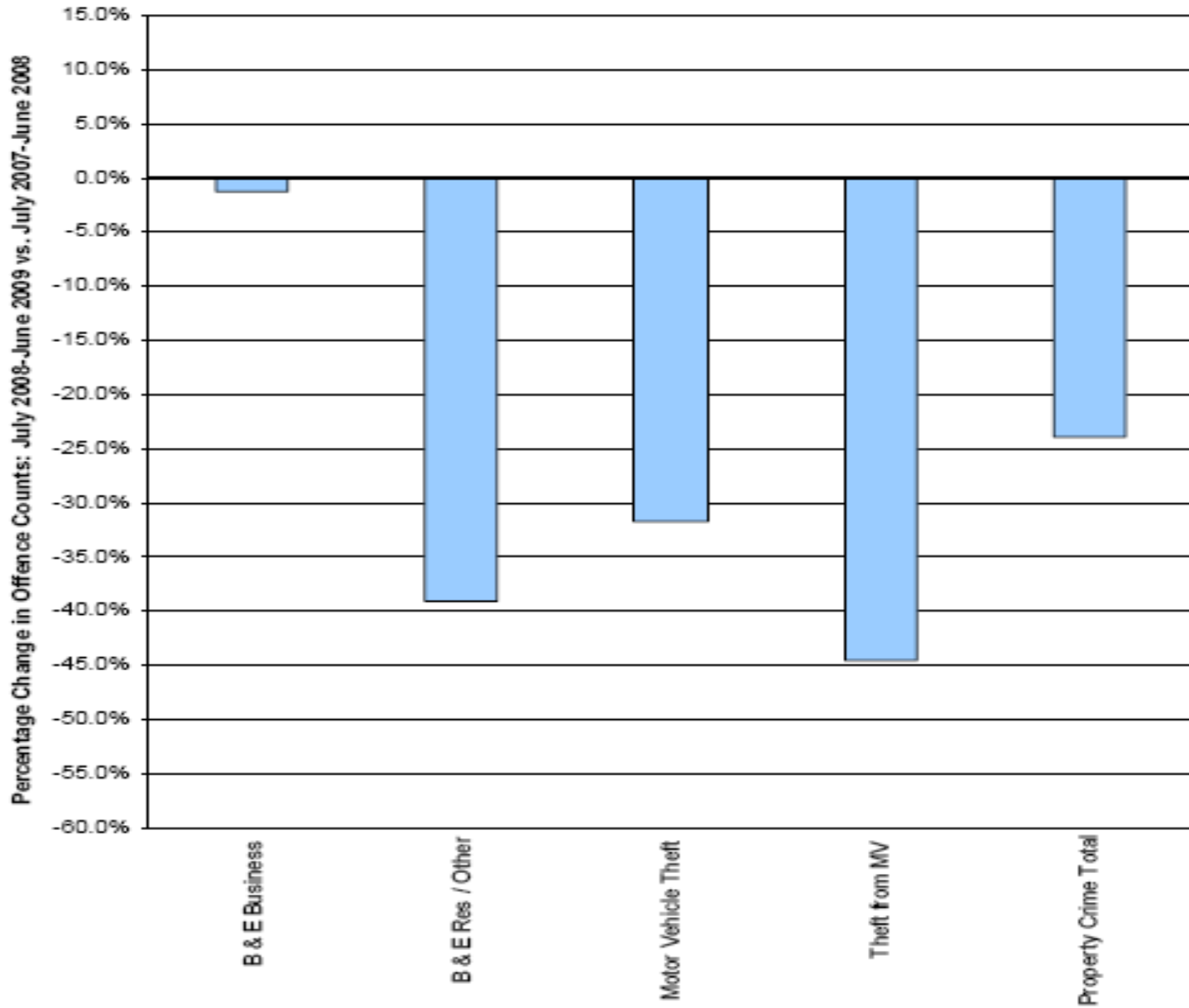


Capital Regional District Property Offence Counts  
Percentage Change July 2008 to June 2009 vs. July 2007 to June 2008

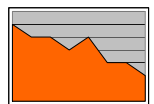
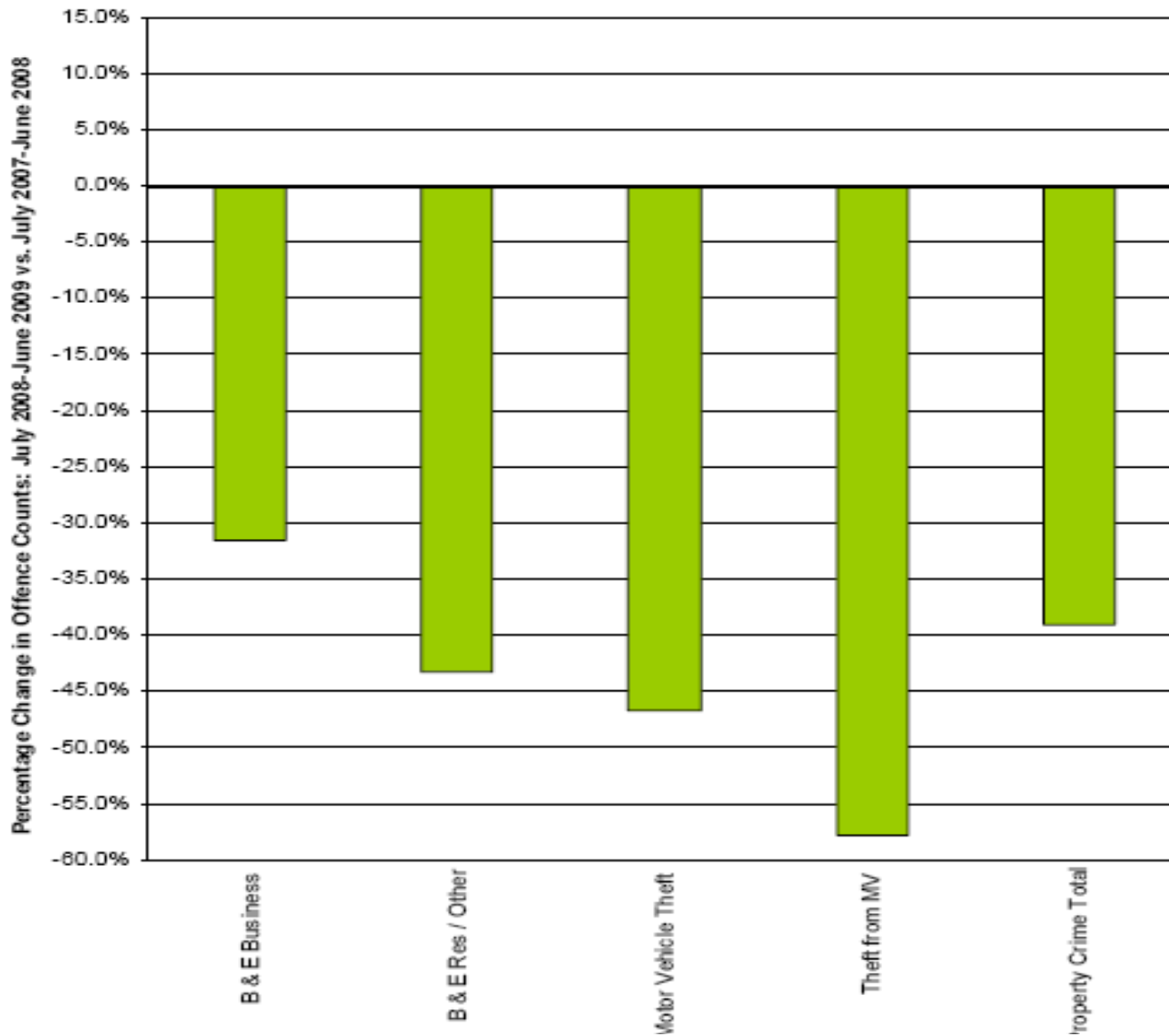


## Williams Lake Property Offence Counts

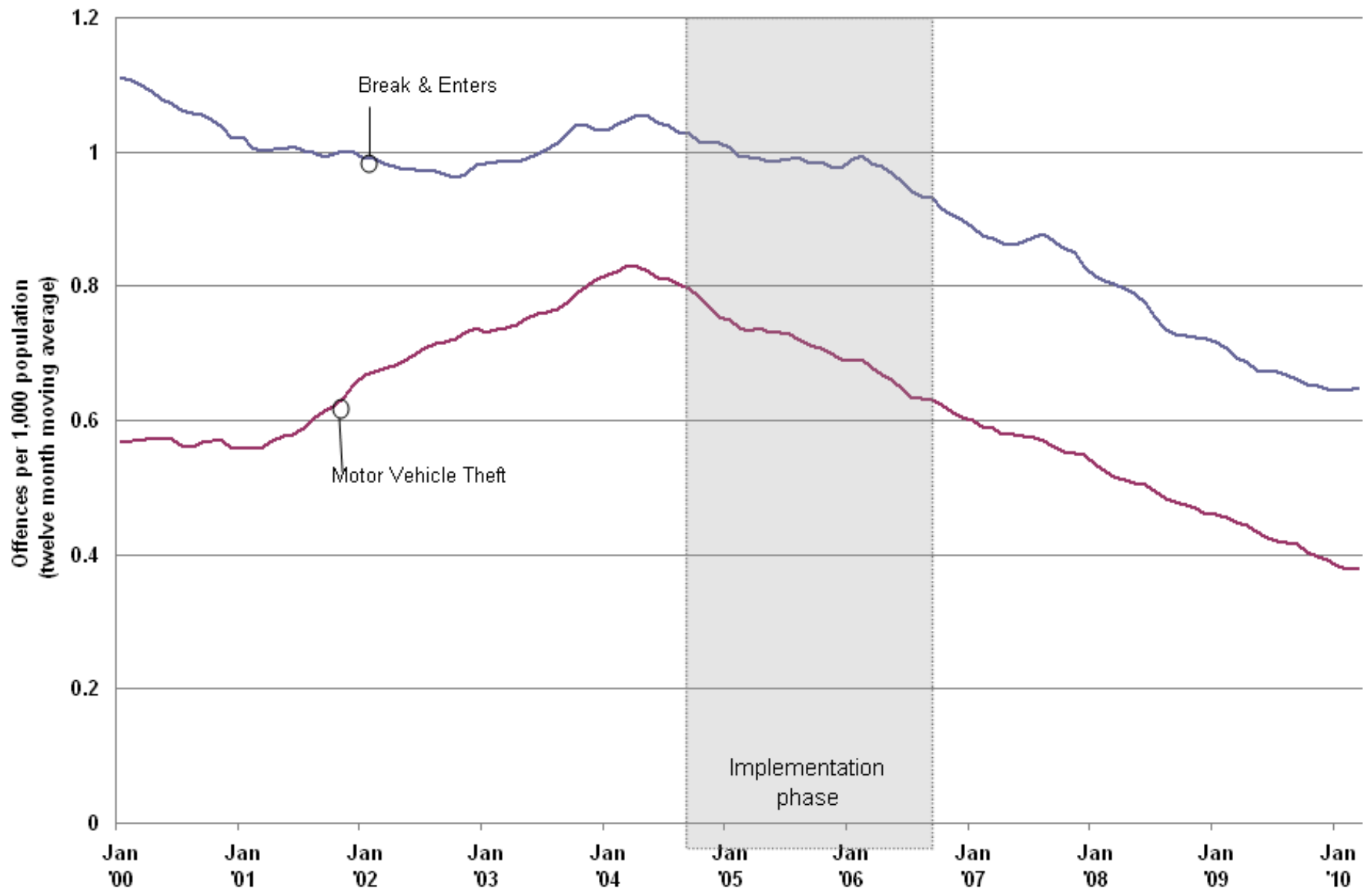
Percentage Change July 2008 to June 2009 vs. July 2007 to June 2008



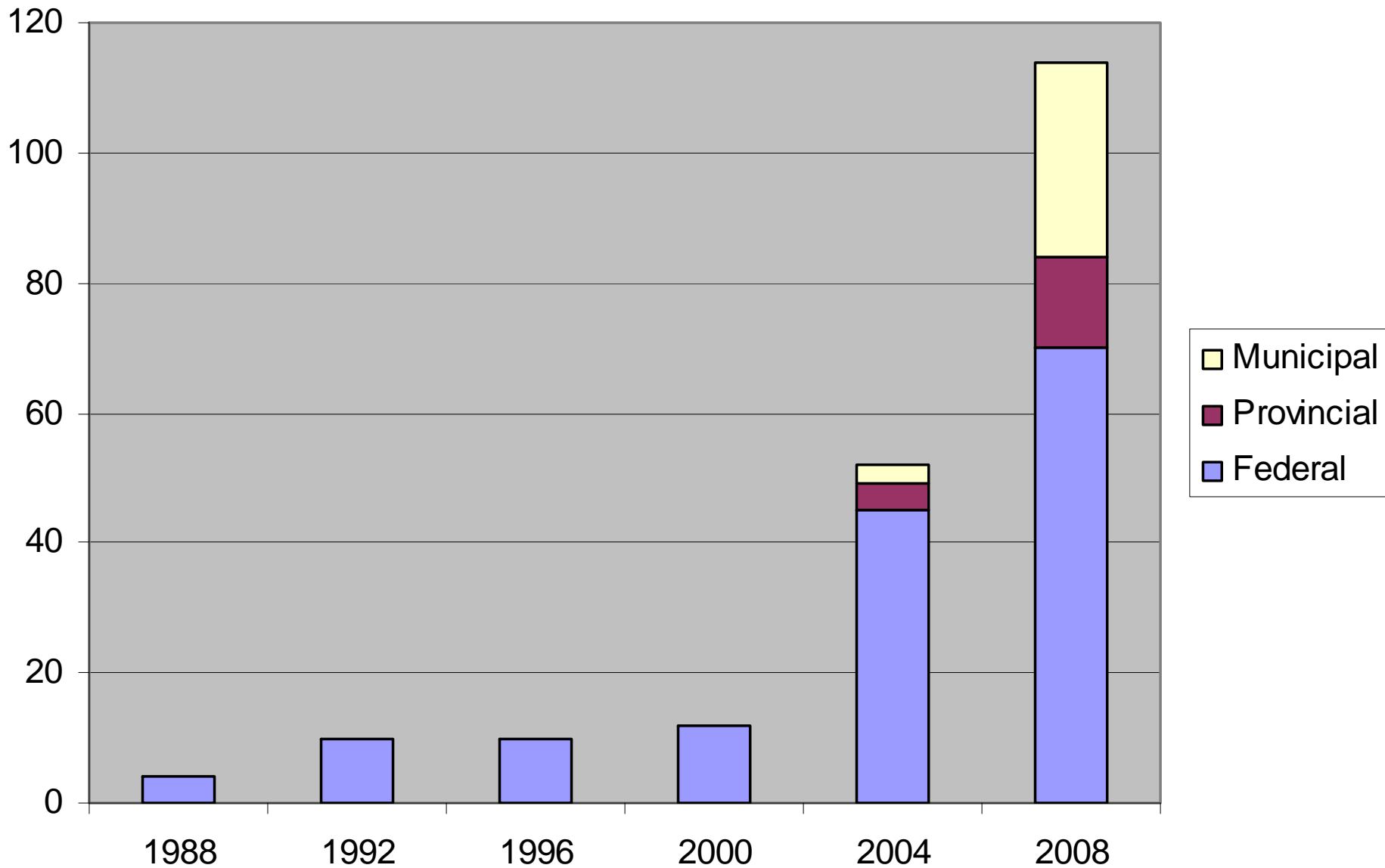
**Kamloops Property Offence Counts**

### Civilian number crunchers get results for RCMP

Mining data on released offenders and crime patterns gives police a heads-up

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Once, police kept an eye out for newcomers in town who might be up to trouble.

"You'd hear somebody had come to town and they were a bit of a problem, and you would sort of keep an eye on them and go and have a talk to them," recalled Superintendent Jim Begley of the RCMP detachment in Kamloops.

Now the police have Sarah Palmer.

The 43-year-old criminal intelligence analyst with the Kamloops detachment is one of several civilians at the forefront of a cutting-edge approach to this old tactic. It's part of a pro-active trend in targeting crime – a Crime Reduction Initiative (CRI) touted by B.C. Mounties that relies on thinking ahead of criminals.

Ms. Palmer harvests patterns. She uses databases to map the release of offenders – especially for property-crime offences – their particular crime tactics, conditions for their release, their arrival in Kamloops, and any new crimes that may occur after they get to town. Crunch it all together and it helps her direct police to check on offenders.
